By the end of June, we were open to accept a limited number of late-submission papers for making the TRIZ Symposium as fruitful as possible for all the presenters and participants. We accepted 7 papers. We have revised our Advanced Agenda of the Symposium as you see now in our second announcement. Based on this revised Agenda and according to the Guide to Presenters, please submit your final manuscripts by the due date (July 26, 2010 (Monday)).

- (2) As the results, we now have 44 (invited/contributed) presentations (including 16 from overseas). They are at the same level in number with those in the previous years (43 papers in 2009 and 46 in 2008) and at a higher level in quality, we believe.
- (3) While rearranging the Agenda, we set 2 Poster Sessions, having 7 papers each, and reserving 100 minutes each (instead of 80 minutes in our earlier plan). In the Third-day afternoon, we reduced 3 Oral Sessions in sequence into 2 Oral Sessions, for finishing earlier even slightly.
- (4) In the revision, we decided to reassign 3 papers from Oral Sessions to Poster Sessions. We sincerely apologize to the relevant authors for the inconvenience due to the change and are grateful for their understanding.
- (5) We also made various rearrangements of presentations, to make relevant ones in sequence, to hold English speaking presentations in Room B in case of double tracks, etc.

(6) You are requested to submit your Final Manuscripts of the presentations by the due date of July 26, 2010 (Mon.) 18:00 JST. Presentation slides in English are always requested (in cases of overseas authors), while full papers are optional. Maximum number of slides is specified differently for each category (i.e., Keynote/Oral/Poster). For more detail, please refer to the "Call for Papers and Instructions for Submitting the Final Manuscripts", which is posted on our Web site.

(7) In case of Keynote Lectures and Oral presentations, your slides will be projected in English and in Japanese in parallel. The organizing members of Japan TRIZ Society will carry out translation into Japanese. (If you translate your slides into Japanese for yourself, we will be happy to use them.) In case of Poster presentations, we will not be able to do the Japanese translation of your poster slides, except the 2-4 slides to be used in the Poster Introduction Session. For such translation work, we would like you to send us your presentation slides by the due date.

(8) You are advised to make the registration of the Symposium early (by July 16, 2010 (Fri.)), and reserve the hotels for yourselves. You may refer our Web site for more information.

(9) On the previous day of the Symposium, we are going to hold "Nikolai Khomenko: OTSM-TRIZ Introductory Seminar" in Tokyo. Please join us in this event, too. Please make a registration separately.

By virtue of your presentation and participation, we are anticipating another fruitful TRIZ Symposium in Japan with active discussions and communications with many participants coming from Japan and overseas.
